Our undergraduate program jumped to No. 2 among all schools in the latest *U.S. News & World Report* rankings while our online RMI master's degree ranks No. 8 among public universities and No. 12 overall. Also, we recently found out that FSU rose to the No. 3 spot among public universities on the 2026 Best Colleges for Business in America list, rankings released annually by Niche.

Speaking of big changes

Chuck Nyce, who became department chair in January 2023, will change leadership posts in January, becoming executive director of the college's Risk Management and Insurance Center. In his new role, Nyce will focus on his passions for leading and supporting student development, faculty research, public events and increasing exposure for the center and the RMI program. Nyce is one of the most visible professors on FSU's campus, and his expertise on catastrophic risk financing remains in demand, especially in Florida. He has served as interim director of the center since the summer.

Brad Karl, left, the college's State Farm Professor of Risk Management and Insurance, will succeed Nyce as department chair. Karl holds three degrees from the College of Business,

including a Ph.D. in business administration with a major in risk management and insurance. His experience includes three years chairing the Department of Finance and Insurance at East Carolina University.

"I want to thank Chuck for his amazing leadership of the department over the past several years," said **Michael D. Hartline**, dean of the College of Business. Hartline also thanked "Brad for his willingness to serve others and take on this important leadership role."

Record enrollments

Our faculty members and students continue to raise the profile of the program, which explains its amazing growth. The undergraduate RMI major count in April 2025 (just before spring graduation) was 343, an approximate 7% growth from the previous year and the highest ever. We expect to see this growth continue as more freshmen every year choose the College of Business. Additionally, the MS-RMI program now has a record 112 students, representing 50% growth since fall 2024! Thank you to all the faculty and staff members, students, alumni and friends for their efforts in promoting the program.





GLOBAL EXPERIENCES

LONDON, ENGLAND

In May, Patricia "Patty" Born, our Payne H. & Charlotte Hodges Midyette Eminent Scholar in RMI and RMI doctoral coordinator, and associate lecturer Paul Schriefer took 12 RMI majors to the U.K. to study the London insurance market. Highlights included a visit to Markel International, hosted by alumnus Evan Beeh (BS RMI & Marketing '13). Students also toured the iconic Lloyds of London building with the Acrisure London Wholesale team.

Additionally, students were treated to a bird's eye view of the interplay between Lloyds brokers and underwriters, courtesy of Decus Insurance Brokers. They also visited next-gen global specialty insurer Mosaic

Insurance, where they learned about non-mainstream risks in technically complex sectors including political risk, political violence and transactional liability. Finally, this trip was made possible by the generosity of RMI Executive Council member Mark Shealy (BS Accounting '91) of the Florida Surplus Lines Service Office and Mark Arnold of Wholesure Insurance.
