The Dr. William T. Hold/The National Alliance Program in Risk Management & Insurance at Florida State University is hosting its  $2^{nd}$  annual research symposium at the Hotel Effie (Sandestin Golf & Beach Resort) in Miramar Beach, Florida on January 25 – 27, 2024. FSU invites authors to submit papers on any topic related to risk management and/or insurance.

The goal of the symposium is to facilitate a setting where authors can present their work in detail and receive helpful and critical feedback from a group of risk and insurance economists. Authors of accepted papers will be given approximately one hour to present their work and each paper will also be assigned a discussant to provide detailed feedback on the paper. <u>The Dr. William T. Hold/The National Alliance</u> <u>Program in Risk Management & Insurance will provide hotel accommodations for one author of each accepted paper.</u> FSU will also coordinate group transportation between the Destin/Fort Walton Beach airport (VBS) and the Hotel Effie.

**SUBMISSION PROCEDURE:** Submissions are due on September 15, 2023. Submissions should be emailed as PDF attachments to <u>rmi-center@business.fsu.edu</u> with the subject line *Research Symposium*. Although most submissions and most accepted papers are likely to be in full draft or essentially completed form, we actively encourage submission of works-in-progress that would benefit from the longer presentation times. The FSU RMI faculty will serve as the program committee and authors of accepted papers will be notified on Oct. 15, 2023, or soon thereafter.
