Admission Requirements for the Accounting Major:

The Accounting major is a limited access program. To be admitted to the major, students must (1) have completed at least 52 semester hours, (2) have completed ACG 2021, ACG 2071, CGS 2100 or CGS 2518, ECO 2013, ECO 2023, MAC 2233, and STA 2023 with a grade of “C-” or better in each course, and (3) have the required overall GPA on all prior college level work that is in effect at the time they enter the major. Note: Students must have a “B” or better in ACG 2021 and ACG2071 to enroll in any upper-level Accounting course. **The overall GPA required for the 2018-2019 academic year (Fall 2018 Spring 2019, and Summer 2019) is 2.90. The overall GPA required is subject to change each academic year.**

Lower-level Prerequisites for Accounting Majors: All of these courses must be completed with a “C-” or better prior to admission to the Accounting major.

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Accounting Major Area Requirements: Students wishing to register for ACG 3101 and ACG 3341 must (1) pass both ACG 2021 and ACG 2071 with a grade of B or better (“B-“ is not acceptable), and (2) pass an Accounting Competency examination with a grade of 75% or better. For students in the FSU ACG 2021 class, the Accounting Competency material is embedded in the course as a final exam. Students transferring ACG 2021 (or its acceptable equivalent) from another university must register for the FSU Accounting Competency Exam. Students will have one attempt to pass the competency exam. Please contact Luke Gordon at lgordon@business.fsu.edu to be added to the Accounting Competency Exam Canvas site.

Students must also earn a “C” or better (“C-“ is not acceptable) in ACG 3101 as a prerequisite for ACG 3111 and all 4000-level ACG and TAX courses. Students must earn a “C-“ or better in all other required upper-level accounting courses (prefix ACG and TAX). Any student not successful in obtaining the minimum passing grade within two attempts will not be permitted to enroll in that upper-level accounting course again.

Additional Information:

- Students should plan to take all upper-level accounting courses in residence at FSU.
- In addition to the requirements outlined above, each student must complete all University-wide requirements for graduation.** These requirements include liberal studies requirements, the multicultural requirement, the summer residency requirement, the FSU residency requirement, and total hours requirement. Depending on time of admission to Florida State University, University-wide requirements may differ; please consult your advisor.
- Students **must not** enroll in **any** course at another institution without first receiving approval from the College of Business Undergraduate Programs Office. Once enrolled at FSU, students should plan to take their upper-level business courses at FSU. Any exception to this policy must be approved in advance by the College of Business Undergraduate Programs Office. Transfer of upper-level business courses completed prior to enrolling at FSU must be from business colleges at other 4-year, accredited institutions. These courses must be approved for course substitution by the College of Business Undergraduate Programs Office upon entering FSU.
- Effective in 2009, to be eligible to sit for the CPA examination in Florida you must complete 120 semester hours including 24 semester hours of upper-division accounting and tax courses. The FSU undergraduate accounting program satisfies these requirements. CPA licensure in Florida requires one-year of work experience and 150 semester hours including 30 semester hours of upper-division accounting and tax courses. At FSU, students can satisfy the additional educational requirements by completing the **Master of Accounting (MAcc)** program following the undergraduate degree. A 3.0 GPA in upper-division coursework as well as a 550 on the GMAT (preferred) or a GRE of 1200 (150 on each subsection of the revised GRE) taken within the last five years is recommended for admission into the MAcc program. FSU accounting students with a 3.2 upper-division accounting and upper division GPA and a 3.4 cumulative GPA may have the GMAT waived. Application deadlines for the MAcc program are June 1st for fall admission; October 1st for spring admission; and March 1st for summer admission. Summer and fall applicants interested in assistantships and fellowships should apply by January 1st. More information is available at <http://business.fsu.edu/macc>.
- For students who do not pursue the Master of Accounting program, two additional accounting courses must be taken (plus extra hours to reach 150 hours) in order to be licensable as a CPA in Florida. These courses can be taken at any institution accredited by an agency approved by the Florida Board of Accountancy.
